




Commemorating The Teachers

IELTS EXAM PREPARATION - TRUE/FALSE/ NOT GIVEN SIMPLIFIED

IELTS reading tests have True/ False/ Not Given (T/ F/ NG) type questions, which may have 5 to 6 statements and the student is required to mark whether the statements are True; False or Not Given.

All the statements are related to the topic of the given passage. However, the statements in the question may not be direct. All statements need to be analysed only concerning the passage and answered only based on the given passage

Why Do Students Struggle with True/ False/ Not Given or Yes/ No/ Maybe Questions?

Firstly, people are often confused about the true meaning of these three terms.

Secondly, these types of questions cannot be answered by directly spotting or matching keywords.

Let us understand this better.

True Meaning of True/ False/ Not Given

How to understand which of the following statements is true/ false or not given?

Whenever you have a sentence, you first ask “does the passage or author state this statement as a fact or opinion or reason?”

- ✓ If the answer is “yes” the statement is True.
- ✓ If your answer is “not a yes”, you must then ask another question for the same statement – “is this statement, against a fact or opinion or reason mentioned in the passage”. If your answer is “yes” then this statement is False.
- ✓ If your answer to question two is “no” then you must be very careful to ask the third question “no matter how true the statement seems, is this mentioned in the passage”? If the answer is “no”, then this is a Not Given case.

How to Find Answers for T/ F/ NG in the Passages?

Let us look at this statement question. Trade made Britain one of the most powerful nations in the world.

Now the first task is to find out, which paragraph, talks about this fact. If you have annotated (meaning marked or made notes) your passage, you must look at the underlined parts which will help you locate the


information easily.

Once the paragraph is located, comes the trickier part. T/F/NG are not fact or feature-based statements; hence you need to understand the paragraph.

Consolidated Strategy

Thus, to solve a T/ F/ NG type of questions, this is the consolidated strategy:

- ✓ Use annotation technique (i.e., mark or add notes) to single out the paragraph which talks about the said statement. Make sure you mark terms, numbers & figures in the passage when reading it in detail.
- ✓ Evaluate the statement with the “Mantra of Three”.
- ✓ Mark the answer as per the questions.
- ✓ Never make the mistake of assuming the statement to be true or false based on your general knowledge or gut feeling and base it only on what has been written in the passage.

Visitors to the US Required to Be Vaccinated

All international passengers, including Canadians, must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to enter the country via land ports of entry and ferry terminals as of Jan. 22, according to the US Department of Homeland Security. At land ports of entry and ferry terminals along the US-Mexico and US-Canada borders, the regulation applies.

The US had previously required people entering the nation by air transport to be completely vaccinated, but this need has now been extended to land borders. The new rules apply to both necessary and non-essential travel, but not to citizens, lawful permanent residents, or nationals of the United States.

Indians top the list of immigrant founders of Unicorns in US

India, with 66 companies, tops the chart as the country of origin for the immigrant founders of US unicorns, a National Foundation for American Policy (NFAP) data revealed

Around 319 of the 582 American startup companies valued at \$1 billion or more have at least one founder who is an immigrant.

The survey found that around 133 companies have at least one immigrant in a pivotal leadership position, such as CEO, CTO or VP of engineering.

In total, 78%, or 451 of 582 billion-dollar startups have an immigrant founder or an immigrant in a prime leadership position, a Times of India reports said quoting the survey. Moreover, these startup companies have created approximately 859 jobs per company. As per the NFAP research, it is found that out of 10

immigrants who have founded two or more unicorns, four of them are from India- Mohit Aron (founded Nutanix & Cohesity), Ashutosh Garg (Bloomreach & Eightfold.ai), Ajeet Singh (Nutanix & ThoughtSpot), and Jyoti Bansal (AppDynamics & Harness).

The others are Al Goldstein from Uzbekistan, Noubar Afeyan from Lebanon, Ignacio Martinez from

Indians bagged 3.01 lakh H-1B visas during fiscal 2021 – 74% of the total

A recent report released by the US Department of Homeland Security shows that India-born individuals continued to bag a significant portion of H-1B visas allotted during fiscal 2021.

During fiscal 2021, the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) approved 4.07 lakh H-1B applications, a figure slightly lower than that of the earlier year, which stood at 4.26 lakh. In both years, India-born individuals bagged more than 74% of the approved visas.

Of the H-1B applications approved in 2021, 74.1% were from India (as opposed to 74.9% in the earlier year). In numerical terms, these translate to 3.01 lakh and 3.19 lakh successful beneficiaries. China, the second most common country of birth, lagged behind significantly with only 50,328 China-born individuals obtaining an H-1B visa – this was 12.4% of the total approved during 2021. Similarly in the previous year, 51,597 China-born individuals (or 12.1% of the total) were successful in obtaining an H-1B visa.

- ✓ Focus on the theme and most repeated words.

PTE Listening Test: Multiple-choice, choose multiple answers

- ✓ Don't make blind guesses as this question has a negative marking
- ✓ It is recommended you read questions before the audio starts.
- ✓ Stay focused till the end as the answers could be in the end.

PTE Listening Test: Fill in the blanks

- ✓ Use the provided notepad to take notes otherwise, you will miss the next word.

- ✓ Carefully listen and determine whether the word was singular or plural, with an article or not etc.

PTE Listening Test: Highlight correct summary

- ✓ Understand the theme and the message conveyed by the speaker.
- ✓ Use the elimination method to narrow the options.

PTE Listening Test: Select the missing word

- ✓ By the first half of the audio, you will have a good idea about the topic and three-fourths way in you can predict how it will end.

PTE Listening Test: Highlight incorrect words

- ✓ Review your answers before submitting, in case you have missed something.
- ✓ Double-clicking a word will unselect the word. So click only once.
- ✓ This part has negative marking, so be careful.

PTE Listening Test: Write from dictation

It is better if you type your answer directly on the computer instead of taking notes on the notepad first as it will save time.

Check the spellings, singular and plural forms, punctuation etc.
